SERVICES FALL WITHIN A GRANT MAKING PORTFOLIO

Portfolio includes programs that address the following in North Texas: animal welfare, child welfare, disability inclusion and chronic health conditions, mental and behavioral health, and youth experiences. [Learn more here.](#)

PROGRAM SERVES NORTH TEXAS CONSTITUENCY

Organizations must serve residents (companion animals, children, youth and their families) of Dallas-Fort Worth and the surrounding counties. Because the need is so great within North Texas, grants will not be awarded to programs that serve constituencies outside of North Texas - even if a program falls within one of the Foundation's portfolio areas.

INVITED TO APPLY (INTERNATIONAL ONLY)

Because the need is so great around the world, the Foundation's capacity to support organizations working internationally is limited. Therefore, organizations that serve international communities are only invited to apply if contacted by the Foundation.

DESIGNATED 501(C)(3) NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION

The Foundation distributes grants only to qualified public entities or organizations exempt from tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation does not support other private foundations or commercial businesses, nor does it make loans or grants to individuals.

FOLLOWS GRANT MAKING SCHEDULE

For current grantees, the board will not consider a new request until 12 months after the decision to approve the previous grant request or until the grant term is complete (for multi-year grants) AND the Foundation has received the final grant report. For declined requests, the board will not consider a new request until 12 months after the decision to decline the previous grant request.
