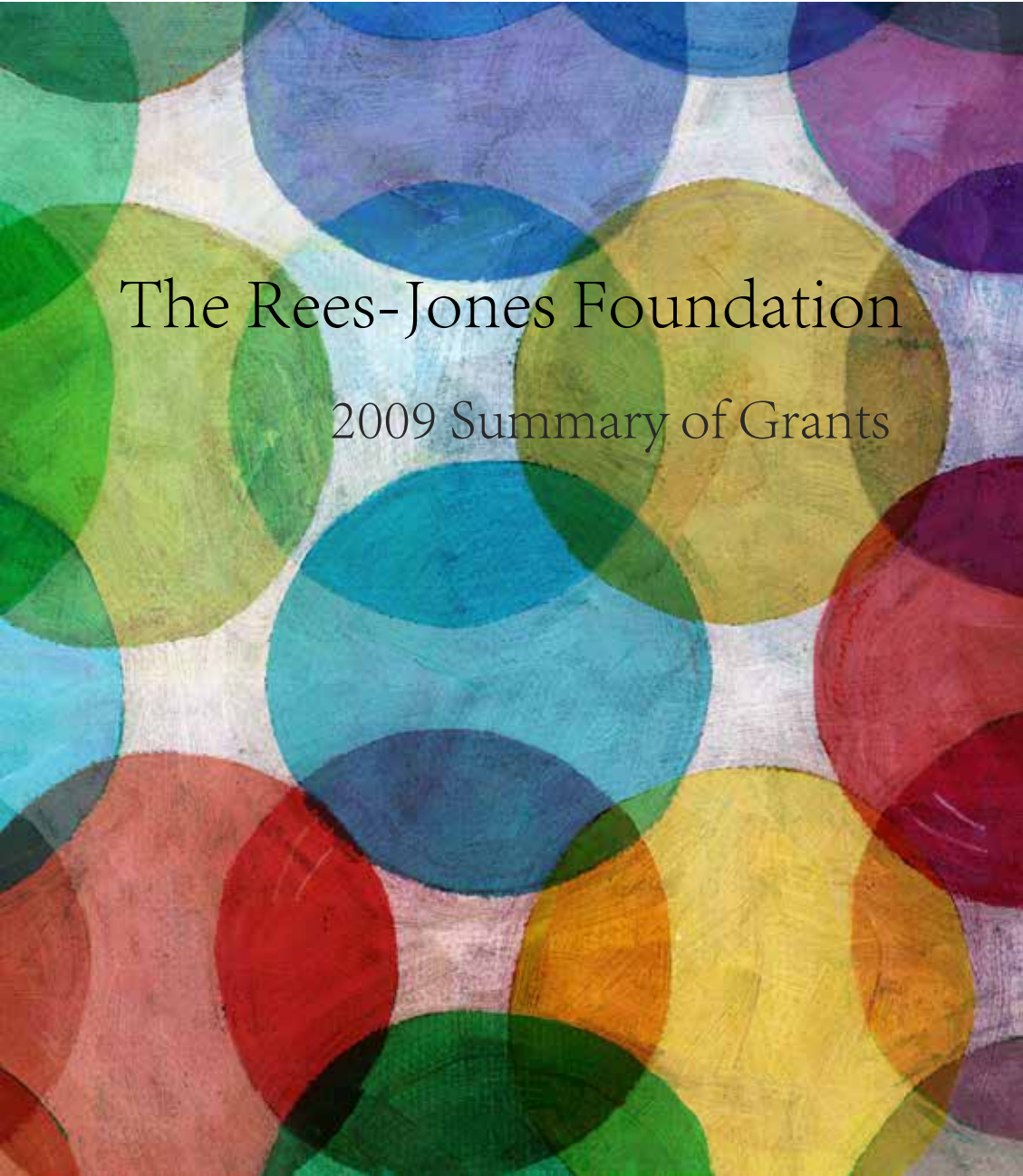




The Rees-Jones Foundation 2009 Summary of Grants



President's Message

2009 presented new challenges to our Foundation and, more importantly, to the agencies working in our community, providing essential services to people in need.

Funding from our Foundation and others was significantly curtailed by the negative investment performance we all experienced in late 2008 and early 2009. This led us to focus more on operating and program maintenance grants, rather than capital and growth. Likewise, most nonprofit agencies responded admirably by cutting budgets and postponing capital needs to continue essential programs.

As the year progressed and investment performance improved, we began to feel renewed confidence, but even so, our activity was significantly less in 2009 than in either of our prior 2 years. Total grants approved in 2009 were \$8,551,800, with close to half of that being a pledge payable in 2010 for the completion of a new home for the SPCA of Texas, which is mentioned later in this report.

Looking back on our 2009 grants, I would like to highlight our continued focus on children at risk in our community. Approximately 25% of our grants were made to organizations that work in this area. We continue to encourage those who are seeking to prevent child abuse and neglect and to preserve healthy families. Organizations that come alongside first-time mothers

and fathers to enhance parenting skills or provide shelter and services to families in crisis or promote physical and mental health and success in education were favored. It is rewarding to see the positive results that come from this work.

However, our society sometimes reacts too slowly to prevent the suffering of children who are exposed to injury, neglect, or family trauma. So we have felt an urgent call to lift up agencies engaged in the difficult work of defending these children, and we hope to encourage the many volunteers and dedicated staff who work in our hospitals, children's advocacy centers, family shelters, and courtrooms speaking for the most vulnerable in our community.

As a foundation, we can think of no more important work for us to support than this. As years go by, our hope is that the need will diminish, but as long as it exists, we hope to stand with some of the most effective of these agencies as they pursue prevention of abuse and neglect, the growth and development of healthy families, and justice and healing for those who have suffered.

Supporting access to basic and preventative care for underserved populations by increasing capacity, expanding existing networks, and developing affordable health care opportunities.

Page 10 **Mental Health Services**

Promoting awareness of mental health needs and increasing access to mental health care by supporting advocacy, therapy services, and preventative care for underserved children and adults.

Page 10 **Youth Programs**

Supporting youth programs that provide children with positive environments in which to learn and grow, focusing on projects that connect underserved children to enriching opportunities.

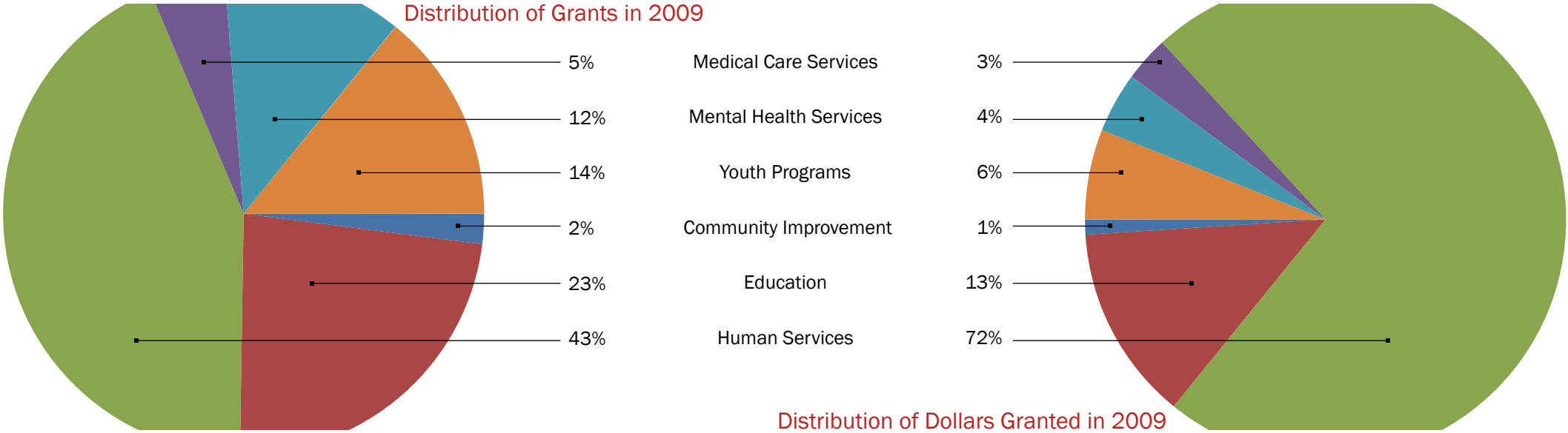

The SPCA of Texas is at the forefront of animal protection and welfare in North Texas, serving the community by operating a shelter, medical clinic, and adoption center for animals that would otherwise be neglected or euthanized.

The humane care, treatment and adoption of animals is an area of particular interest to The Rees-Jones Foundation, so supporting a planned new facility that will enhance and expand the work of the SPCA was a natural fit for the Foundation. The Foundation's significant grant is designed to encourage completion of the capital campaign in 2010 and engage more members of the community in the important work of the SPCA, believing that upholding the ethical and humane treatment of animals affirms the broader commitment to justice and opportunity in the North Texas community.
